



ARVADA/BLUNN RESERVOIR
2012 BOAT INSPECTION REGULATIONS

- All boats entering the reservoir must be clean, drained and dry before entering.
- Car-top carry boats such as kayaks, canoes, and other small craft that are transported on the top of a vehicle will be inspected on the day of use. If it is clean and dry, they will be allowed to launch.
- All trailer mounted boats entering with Arvada's green seal or another lakes attached green seal and a matching *clean, drain and dry exit receipt* will be allowed to enter the reservoir with no quarantine and no boat inspection.
- All trailer mounted boats entering with Arvada's green seal or another lakes attached green seal and missing a *clean, drain and dry exit receipt* will be allowed to enter the reservoir only after passing a boat inspection completed by a Ranger.
- Boats with a green seal and a matching *clean, drain and dry exit receipt* from a contaminated lake may enter the reservoir only if it has been out of the water for 30-days; otherwise there will be a boat inspection and a 14-day quarantine on the boat.
- Boats entering the reservoir with no seal on the boat will be inspected and quarantined for 14-days.
- A red seal will be attached to all boats that are inspected and quarantined for the Arvada/Blunn reservoir.
- All boats leaving the reservoir will have a *clean, drain and dry exit inspection*. **No green seal will be attached to the boat until this inspection is complete.** Upon completion, the Ranger will attach a new green seal and supply the boat owner with a *clean, drain and dry exit receipt*.
- Pontoon boats will only be allowed if it is designed and manufactured in such fashion that a continuous deck surface exists between the pontoons and under the feet of the operator for the length of the boat. Also normal operation of the boat will not result in water flowing over the deck surface of the boat, or operator's body to be immersed in the water in any way.
- Wet aquatic bait is prohibited, as the water in which they originated may carry mussel larvae. This includes, but is not limited to minnows, leeches, frogs, crayfish and salamanders.
