West Woods Golf Club is nestled at the base of the foothills in Arvada. Its 230 acres include majestic vistas, native grasslands, and riparian areas. These native areas provide habitat for local wildlife. Ralston Creek, the Farmer's Highline Canal and the Church Ditch meander through the golf course. In the 15 acres of ponds and wetlands you will find a variety of wildlife such as nesting red-tail hawks, deer, cottontails and coyote dens. The Butterfly Garden complements the clubhouse and is designed with a colorful variety of interesting plant material.

West Woods Golf Club is certified as an Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary due to the efforts of staff and volunteers. This Sanctuary Program for golf courses is in cooperation with the United States Golf Association (USGA) and promotes environmental stewardship and provides guidance to help preserve and enhance wildlife habitat, protect natural resources and enhance awareness of our natural areas. 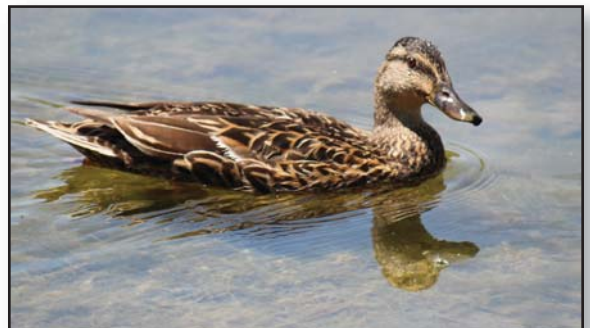
